Itinerary on joining basis (S.I.C.) :

Day 1 Kuala Lumpur / Chiangmai	Khantoke Dinner
Upon arrival at Chiang Mai Airport, meet and transfer to hotel by local representative. After that, you will be visiting the Doi Suthep Temple where the panoramic view of the city and the surrounding countryside can be seen from the temple grounds. Khantoke Dinner & Thai Cultural Dance Show will be served.	
Day 2 Chiangmai	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner
After breakfast in the hotel, visit Elephant Camp . In the camp, there will be an elephant show. There are also elephants for you to ride (optional only). After lunch, continue visit Orchid Farm . On display are a profusion of blooms of all varieties, shapes, colors and prices, from a few baht for the common strains to a few hundred thousand for the rare and exotic species. After lunch, proceed to visit the local handicraft centre such as silk, cotton, jewellery, woodcarving and silverware. Lunch and dinner will be served at local restaurant.	
Day 3 Chiangmai - Lampang - Chiangmai	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner
After breakfast in the hotel, transfer to Lampang, visit Ban Sao Nak , it means "house of many pillars". Ban Sao Nak is an extravagant and unique blend of Burmese and Lanna architectures. Then, take a ride in a Horse-Drawn Carriage around Lampang. Next, visit Wat Chedi Sao , The name literally means "the Temple of Twenty Chedis" and one look at the 20 stupas in the temple courtyard makes it easy to understand the origin of the name, Wat Phra That Lampang Luang which express the original northern Thai architecture. Transfer back to Chiangmai. Lunch and dinner will be served at local restaurant.	
Day 4 Chiangmai / Kuala Lumpur	Breakfast
After breakfast at hotel, free at own leisure until time for transfer to airport for your flight back home. FREE ENTRANCE PASS TO ROYAL FLORA FESTIVAL (09 Nov 11 - 15 Feb 2011 only)	

The grand Royal Flora Festival consist of a prominent part that will be the Hor Kham Royal Pavilion, constructed in the exquisite Lanna architectural style, showcasing HM the King's activities as one of the foremost agriculturalists in the world. More than 8,000 plant and flower species will be showcased here, all displayed in various themes. There will be 30 decorative gardens of the international participants, including 23 existing international gardens from the last show, plus seven new zones from Armenia, Canada, Nigeria, Pakistan, South Korea, Taiwan, and Yemen.
