Your this afternoon sightseeing tour will take you to the enchantment of Old city:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◆ <b>Kotagede</b>, is inheritance of Old Mataram Kingdom. Located around 10 kilometers at the southeastern part of Yogyakarta city center, the area is now well known as Kotagede as the center of silver handicrafts in Yogyakarta. Keeping around 170 old buildings built in 1700 to 1930, "Kotagede is not only named Silver City but an Old Capital City"</li> <li>◆ <b>Visits Batik Home Industry</b></li> <li>◆ <b>Kasongan Village</b>, Close look at ceramic handicrafts making that is done from generation to generation while hunting beautiful hand-made collections produced by skillful craftsmen</li> </ul> <p>Enjoy your Dinner at Sederhana Restaurant</p>

0630-0800am 0800am	<p>Breakfast available at hotel's restaurant</p> <p>Depart hotel for the sightseeing around Jogjakarta.</p> <p>Yogyakarta is also a good base for a to the world's most impressive archeological site and famous for its rich heritage. Your today sightseeing will includes the following places of interests:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◆ <b>Kaliadem or Kaliurang village</b>, Viewing the Merapi Volcano from the distance</li> <li>◆ <b>Borobudur</b> is the biggest Buddhist temple in the ninth century measuring 123 x 123 meters. It was completed centuries before Angkor Wat in Kamboja. This Buddhist temple has 1460 relief panels and 504 Buddha effigies in its complex. Millions of people are eager to visit this building as one of the World Wonder Heritages.</li> <li>◆ <b>Candi Mendut</b>, is older than Candi Borobudur. There are stories for children on its walls. Located 3 kilometers eastward from <a href="#">Borobudur</a> Temple. It is a Buddhist temple, built in 824 A.D. by King Indera of Cailendra dynasty.</li> <li>◆ <b>Candi Pawon</b>, one and half kilometers westward from Mendut Temple and eastward from <a href="#">Borobudur</a> Temple, it is also a Buddhist temple. When appreciating in detail, its sculpture is the beginning of <a href="#">Borobudur</a> sculpture. Pawon Temple is not a grave but as a place to keep King Indra's weapon namely <i>Vajranala</i>. This temple was built with volcanic stones. Architecturally it is a blend of old Javanese Hindu and Indian art. Pawon temple is exactly in the central point of the straight line stretched from <a href="#">Borobudur</a> to Mendut Temple.</li> <li>◆ <b>Visit Salak Fruit Plantation</b></li> </ul>

A full day journey of exploring Jogjakarta and its sister city will features the following places of interest: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◆ <b>Prambanan Temple.</b> the biggest and most beautiful Hindhus Temple in Indonesia, locally known as Roro Jonggrang, is the masterpiece of Hindu culture of the tenth century</li> <li>◆ <b>Kraton</b> or the Palace where Sultan and his family of Yogyakarta live is located in the center of the axis stretching from the north to the south, and in the secondary axis from the east to the west</li> <li>◆ <b>Taman Sari</b>, known as water castle; this was once a splendid pleasure park of Palace, pool and waterways for the sultan and his entourage. The architect of this elaborate retreat built between 1758 and 1765 was a Portuguese from Batavia.</li> <li>◆ <b>Malioboro Street</b> Enjoy shopping experience, hunting exclusive souvenirs of Jogja, you may walk on foot along the arcades of Malioboro Street.</li> <li>◆ <b>Beringharjo Market</b> <i>has been functioning as a trading place since 1758.</i> These two connected shopping area offer merchandise, ranging from batik, traditional snacks, Javanese herbs, Buddha effigy, rattan ornament, leather puppet, and handicrafts to the modern fashions and Jewelry.</li> </ul>
