Gamelan, classical and contemporary Javanese dances, wayang kulit (leather puppet), theater and other expressions of traditional art will keep the visitor spellbound. Local craftsmen excel in arts such batiks, silver and leather works.

ITINERARY

Yogyakarta is often called the main gateway to the Central Java as where it is geographically located. It stretches from Mount Merapi to the Indian Ocean. It is commonly considered as the modern cultural of Central Java. Although some may prefer Solo as a good runner up, Yogyakarta remains the clear front-runner for traditional dance, Wayang (traditional puppetry) and music. It has numerous thousand-year-old temples as inheritances of the great ancient kingdoms to explore. Here are your touring & journey program during your stay in Jogja:

DAY 01: ARRIVING JOGJAKARTA – JOGJA CITY TOUR (L/D)

- ◆ Meet upon arrival, you will be directly taken in to Ibu Citro Restaurant to experience Jogja's succulent Gudeg Jogja Dishes and Javanese style deep fried chicken
- ◆ Soon after you finish your lunch, you will be taken to explore Yogyakarta (some people call it Jogja, Jogjakarta, or Yogya) is a city with outstanding historical and cultural heritage. Your this afternoon sightseeing tour will take you to the enchantment of Old city:
 - **Kotagede**, is inheritance of Old Mataram Kingdom. Located around 10 kilometers at the southeastern part of Yogyakarta city center, the area is now well known as Kotagede as the center of silver handicrafts in Yogyakarta. Keeping around 170 old buildings built in 1700 to 1930, "Kotagede is not only named Silver City but an Old Capital City"
 - **Visits Batik Home Industry**
 - **Kasongan Village**, Close look at ceramic handicrafts making that is done from generation to generation while hunting beautiful hand-made collections produced by skillful craftsmen
- ◆ Enjoy your Dinner at Sederhana Restaurant or similar

DAY 02: THE WORLD'S WONDER AND A MOUNTAIN JOURNEY (B/L/D)

- ◆ Breakfast buffet served at hotel
Yogyakarta has more than just culture though. It is a very lively city and a shopper's delight. The main road, Malioboro Street, is always crowded and famous for its night street food-culture and street vendors. Your today sightseeing will includes the following places of interests:
 - **Kaliadem or Kaliurang village**, Viewing the Merapi Volcano from the distance
 - **Borobudur** is the biggest Buddhist temple in the ninth century measuring 123 x 123 meters. It was completed centuries before Angkor Wat in Kamboja. This Buddhist temple has 1460 relief panels and 504 Buddha effigies in its complex. Millions of people are eager to visit this building as one of the World Wonder Heritages.
 - **Candi Mendut & Pawon**, are older than Candi Borobudur. There are stories for children on its walls. Located 3 kilometers eastward from Borobudur Temple. It is a Buddhist temple, built in 824 A.D. by King Indera of Cailendra dynasty. Architecturally it is a blend of old Javanese Hindu and Indian art. Pawon temple is exactly in the central point of the straight line stretched from Borobudur to Mendut Temple.
 - **Visit Salak Fruit Plantation**
- ◆ **Authentic Javanese Lunch at WaroengJogja Restaurant**
- ◆ **Dinner at Sintawang Restaurant or similar**

DAY 03: TOURING THE CITY'S HERITAGE & HINDU MONASTERY (B/L/D)

- ◆ Breakfast served at hotel
Yogyakarta was in the 16th and 17th centuries the seat of the mighty Javanese empire of Mataram from which present day Yogyakarta has the best inherited of traditions. It has numerous thousand-year-old temples as inheritances of the great ancient kingdoms. It is a city with outstanding historical and cultural heritage. A full day journey of exploring Jogjakarta city will features the following places of interest:
 - **Prambanan Temple**. the biggest and most beautiful Hindu Temple in Indonesia, locally known as Roro Jonggrang, is the masterpiece of Hindu culture of the tenth century
 - **Kraton** or the Palace where Sultan and his family of Yogyakarta live is located in the center of the axis stretching from the north to the south, and in the secondary axis from the east to the west
 - **Taman Sari**, known as water castle; this was once a splendid pleasure park of Palace, pool and waterways for the sultan and his entourage. The architect of this elaborate retreat built between 1758 and 1765 was a Portuguese from Batavia.
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 - **Visits Batik Home Industry**
